French men-of-war came out to escort ships into port of St. Nazaire. Warped into interior harbour, and made fast in afternoon. Orders that no one was to be permitted ashore without pass.O.C. landed to report. Advance party of 50 under Lieut. R.W.Frost left by train for railhead. Short goatskin coats served out to men. Left St. Nazaire at 7 a.m. for railhead. Passed through several large towns on way. No. 4 Company (French-Canadian) sang old French songs during halts, which greatly astonished the inhab-Discipline on train excellent, though conditions were anything but comfortable for the men. Detrained quickly and in good order Arrived Hazebrouck 6 a.m. Picked up advance party under Lieut. Frost, and left by road for Fletre, passing 3rd Bde H.Q. in "The House of the Spy" in Caestre. Pave roads very trying for the men, accustomed to soft English roads, but no stragglers. Arrived Fletre about mid-day. At last halt before reaching Fletre, H.R.H. Prince Arthur of Connaught rode along column. On reaching Fletre men were billeted in houses in village and surrounding farms. Battn H.Q. in Chateau de Wendigen. On March to Fletre all ranks interested in hearing sound of distant artillery for first time. Censoring men's letters. H.Q. Mess established in village inn. Signal lamps placed in Chateau tower for communication with outlying Company H.QS. 3rd Canadian Infantry Brigade inspected by Gen.Sir John French in field near Caestre. Apparently much pleased . Stated that if we could fight as well as we looked, he was sorry for the Bermans. Capt. Battle of Neuve Chapelle began with tremendous bembardment of enemy lines by British, about 3 miles to our right, at half past seven in the morning. About 8 o'cleck infantry advance began. No sign of movement of British Brigade en our immediate right, but everything was in order for the 14th. to advance if called upon. Would have been difficult operation unless Germans eppesite us were attacked on flank, as wire in front of German trenches had not been shelled, and was uncut. Battle centinued throughout the day. Very little news came to us, except that British attack had been successful on the right, but that left nearest Canadians had been held up. Were able to observe bembardment from O.P. in our support lines all through the day. Men very much worked up and anxious to be in the fight. Fighting still going on at Neuve Chapelle. Stretcher-bearer Drake recommended for the Distinguished Conduct Medal. He went to the assistance of a man who was wounded in the open behind our front line. Drake was almost immediately severely wounded himself but remained with the man after he had bound up his wounds, being under centinusus fire, until assistance manking came which enabled him to get the wounded man back to our lines. The recommendation was approved, and the medal awarded Drake, who was the first man in the 1st Canadian Division to obtain it. Quiet day on our front. Some fighting still going on at Neuve Chapelle. Usual schedule shelling and sniping. Night of 12th/13th lost one man (Pte A Jones)killed, and one man wounded of a patrol which was out in No-Man's Land. They were caught by machine gun fire. Sergt. Lang and 3 men went out and searched carefully, remaining out till dawn, but could find no trace of Jones. It is supposed he was taken either dead or alive by enemy patrol which was known to be out also. Relieved at night by 15th Battn. Relief more quickly done this tour. Same billets as last time out. Westher fine. No parades. Men given absolute rest. No parades except rifle inspections. Men played football in the afternoon. Relieved 15th Battn. in same sub-sector at night. Nos. 3.4. and 1 Cos. in front line, beginning from right, No. 2 Coy. in support. Fairly quiet. One man killed and two wounded by snipers. Enemy evidently searching for our batteries as they fired six heavy shells into a field near corner of Rue Du Bois and Sailly-Fromelles Road, but there was no battery

German aeroplane over our lines, first one we had seen. Too high for rifle fire to be effective.

Heaviest casualties up to date. Three men killed and seven wounded. Troops in German line opposite us had apparently been relieved by others who were much more agressive. Relieved at night by 15th Battn.

No work. Battn. resting.

Relieved 15th Battn. at night.Nos. 2,1 & 4 Cos. in front line, beginning from right. No 3 in support.
Quiet day.

Heavy day. Many wounded. The 3rd Canadian Brigade was relieved by 24th British Brigade, the 14th Batth being relieved by the 1st Worcesters, commanded by Major Gregan. 14th was complimented by the G.O.C.24th British Bde for the quickness and accuracy with which the trenches were handed ever. Left considerable quantity of trench property, such as periscopes, very pistols, etc. with the Worcesters, and was questioned by 3rd Bde. as to why this was done. Worcesters had lost everything in the Battle of Neuve Chapelle a fewe days before, and it was impossible as well as dangerous to leave them without these steres. Batth. marched back to rest billets at Estaires, arriving about midnight.

Very comfortable billets in northeast end of town, near cemetery. Battalien being paid, and men sent by Companies to Divisional Baths in Estaires where they had het baths and clean underclothes were issued to them.

Dammed up the Courant de Meteren-Becque, a small stream which flowed through our billeting area, and made swimming pool for the men. Alloted it to Companies at regular hours. This was much enjoyed by the men. New clothing issued, and deficiencies in equipment made good.

Estaires bembed by German planes. No casualties in the battalien. Training begun, special attention being paid to bembing and entrenching.

Training carried on.


