1917 LIEUT-GOLONEL C.W. PECK, COMMANDING. April. FORWARD 9th Operations are now commenced in accordance with Operation Orders No 106 dated April 4th 1917. 00.108 Today is ZERO Day, and ZERO HOUR is 5.30 s.m. marked AREA. Battalion on our Right,:- 14th Canadian Infantry Battalion, "ROYAL MONTREAL REGIMENT"
Battalion on our Left :- 18th Canadian Infantry Battalion, 2nd Canadian Division. #P# a.m. Our Barrage commenced. 5.32 a.m. First Wave of Battalion went over. (1 Piper went with each Company and Pipe Major with H.O.) All objectives reached according to Operation Orders No 106. As Intelligence Officer was wounded and could not report location of further advanced Battle Headquarters for Battalion, Colonel Peck decided to establish Headquarters in a dugout in ZWISCHEN STELLUNG, and moved forward accordingly. All arrangements re consolidating were carried out in accordance with Operation Orders No 105. Battalion on Right is now :- 15th Canadian Infantry Battalion, 45th Highlanders of Canada. :- 18th Canadian Infantry Battalion, 2nd Canadian Division. During advance we captured 1 -77m.m., calibre Enemy gun, several Machine Guns and 1 Minenwerfer Thrower. Approximate number of prisoners taken, at very least 100; these were sent to the rear of our lines. Lieut. Colonel C. W. Peck goes to hospital sick. Major R. O. Bell-Irving, M. MARRATIVE OF 16th Battalion "THE CANADIAN SCOTTISH" in the ACTION against HILL 70 on AUGUST 15th/16th.1917. The Headquarters and there companies went into the 24 trenches on the night of 13th/14th August, one company taking over the line from a portion of the 3rd Canadian Infantry Hattalian and the other company going into Reserve at LOSS.

The day of the 14th passed fairly quietly with occasional shelling of the trenches and the back sempany country.

All companies had been leaved as far as possible with their Battle Equipment, but bombs and shovels had to be picked up at the Battalion Dump.

The assembling of the Battalion was carried out with the greatest order and precision and, as well as the action itself, reflects the greatest credit on the company officers and non

commissioned officers.

It was a difficult position from which to launch an assault as the only trenches available were the front line and the support line, which run across behind the front line, the left of it being 150 yards behind and the right converging into the front line.

It meant assembling a great number of men in the front-line and, had the enemy opened these a heavy berrage before ZERO hour, our attack might have been paralysed before it was launched. The occupanies were assembled in the following order:— ROUT LIEF - which traded from BOYAU 47 to road Junction at H. 51

B.7.5. On the Left.-No.1 company under Lieut Petrie with a mopping-up platom from No.3 company.

On the Right.No.2 company under A/Major Gilliat with a mopping-up plateon from No.3 company.

SUPPORT LINE - Ro.4 company under A/Major Murphy with a mopping -up

The remaining platoon from No.3 company was the wiring platon and Liout Holver, with a veteran's wisdom, had draw then up as near the front line as possible so as to get into "Yo man's land" quickly and ecospe the Barrage. (It is a pleasing thing to note the sagasity with which our old officers and non odemassioned officers prepare for an attack - having learned all the Hun's tricks - and taking propartions to dirouseent him, showing that they are keeping pace with the changes in trench warfare.)

At 2130 a.m. on the 15th., notification was received that the Battalion was in position, and Brigade was so informed.

The intervening time between 2.30 and ZERO hour at 4.25

a.m. was a most anxious one indeed. The enemy was very restless and nervous and sent up a great number of flares of extraordinary were reported during the night.

At ZERO hour the whole Battalion leaped out of the trembes

led by its Pipers. The shaport company, No.4, doubling forward and reached "No man's land" in time to escape the enous Barrage.

Our Artillery was most, and very few "shorts" were reported, and the companies were enabled to follow the barrage very closely. In crossing "No man's land", the hight company reported seeing numbers of the enemy retiring from the front lime overland.

No.6 Machine Gun of that company, under L/Cpl. Hartley was most aggressive in firing on the retreating enemy.
All companies report that there was little or no res-

istance in the German front line and support line. Our Canadian Infantry are now so superior to the German Infantry (even the orack Divisions) that they carry trench after tranch with the utmost regularity, and have a hearty contempt for them as they pass, simply dropping mopping-up parties to clean up the work.

The Boundaries and different trenches were not nearly so easily disernable in the advance as had been anticipated.

Our Left company, for a period, bore too far to the left and left a gap. This was remedied by the wiring platoon under Lieut. J. McLyor, who acted with celerity and denistes, making the platoon who acted with celerity and decision, making his platoon drop their wire, and threw them into the gap. Direction, however, was soon restored and the BLUE LIME was reached on schedule time.

During the consolidation of the BUDE LINE, a few causalties were caused by machine gun fire, but otherwise, no difficulties were smoomtered. The companies were reorganized in the BLUE LIME in perfect order. From this point, the support company, No. 4, was to continue the assault on the Left, while No.2 company was to

go ahead again on the Right.

These companies advanced on the minute, and reached the These companies advanced on the minute, and remoded the GREM LHE on time. The trench there was very much desclibed by our Artillery fire, and it was hard, at first, to determine if it was the final objective, so our troops jurned the fleshing enemy for some distance beyond, until their officers signalled then to return, which they did with splendid discipline and order. Communication was soon setablished with the 7th Pathlion

on our Right and the 13th Battalion on our Left. Consolidation on our right and the 19th nestation on our hers, consolidation was rapidly proceeded with, and Lewis Cone Posts established, trench Blocks put in and a Strong point constructed by No.1 Cov. at Junction of HURRAH and HART Alley; vis: Strong Point 5, as directed.

We had considerable hard fortune at first, by gettying runners wounded, and all our lines were shot away one after the other. The Signallers worked with opurage and persistance, and L/Cpl. Hastings finally got a line through which endured until the Battalion was relieved.

Although the day of the 15th and the night following were fairly quiet in the front line. the rear trenches were

The heavy shell fire of the loth was greatly abated at Midnight and we were relieved by one company of the 2nd and one company of the 3rd Battalions in the early morning of the 17th. Looking back over the history of the action, I may say that it was perhaps the best prepared and systematically carried out of any we have been in. The support of our Artillery and machine guns, was all

that could be asked.

All the officers from other units who worked with us did their duty excellently.

The control of our troops by the officers and non commissioned officers was manifested on several occasions. Thile they davanced with their ouetmany spirit and valour, I think they displayed better discipline than ever before, which perhaps is the result of the experience gained in many battles. Obstacles which formerly distracted their attention, now are considered only in their proper impostance.

When we consider that the advance was made against the best troops of the famous German army, we can only be the more

convinced that our Canadian Troops are the best in Europe.

I desire to give my utnost praise and commendation to all the officers, non commissioned officers and men, who served under me in this attack. They were as combled with great care and precision, charged with valour and determination, and afterwards held the line with the steadiness and fortitude that has characterized the Battalion throughout its whole career.


