Besides the wound in the head be was wounded by revolver chots in leg and arm and by a bomb in the other leg.

Immediately on receipt of the report Major Will cock, M.C. in command of "C" Company took out a strong patrol to examine the locality and endeavor to remyer Pte. Grant, and he was assisted by Major Topp in command of B Company on his right who took out a patrol for a similar purpose. No trace of Pte.
